# ALL STAR L.A.

Live like an A-lister—if only for a day or two—with this insider's guide to Tinseltown.

## WEST HOLLYWOOD

Called "WeHo" by its hip inhabitants, this vibrant city in LA County is home to the iconic Sunset Strip and shines brightest during entertainment awards season (January to March).

**AM** Los Angeles has gone bananas for cold-pressed juice so kick-start the day at **Pressed Juicery** on Santa Monica Boulevard (Nicole Richie is a fan). Then head to Robertson Boulevard to shop at **Kiison**, a favourite among the Kardashians and Emily VanCamp, thanks to its designer fashion and kitch collectables. Homewares more your thing? Design maven **Kelly Wearsler** has a flagship store on Melrose; it's a glittering treasure trove of her signature mixed-meal pieces. Last stop: **Skin Laundry** for the signature laser facial. The treatment gets stars like Whitney Port camera-ready in 10 minutes flat.

**PM** Make like Scarlett Johansson and cross the border into Hollywood for Mediterranean share plates at The Redbury Hotel's **Cleo** (where scenes from *Entourage* were filmed). Around the corner, **No Vacancy** (a haunt of Robert Pattinson) justifies LA's love of small bars, though this one takes it up a notch with high-wire acrobatic shows.

**RED** The **Andaz West Hollywood** (approx. \$300 per night; westhollywood.andaz.com) on the Sunset Strip features views of either the LA skyline or the Hollywood Hills from every room. Design touches, like vinyl records, are a clever nod to its former incarnation as a hangout for rockers such as The Rolling Stones.

## BEVERLY HILLS

The famous postcode, 90210, has built on its reputation, adding new high-end shopping, dining and fashion hotspots to its line-up.

**AM** Luxury shopping strip Rodeo Drive was made famous by *Pretty Woman* and those in the know make a beeline for Vera Wang and Jimmy Choo (both unveiled couture new boutiques this year). While you're there, check out the **Walk of Style**, the seasonal equivalent of the Hollywood Walk of Fame, which includes a plaque honouring its Style and Audi Women of Style Award winner Catherine Mansin. For afternoon tea, you can't beat Beverly Hills Hotel's **Polo Lounge**, which has played host to Marlene Dietrich and Nicole Kidman. The three tiers of scones, sandwiches and cakes are heavenly.

**PM** Beverly Hills is a magnet for fine dining. Aussie chef Curtis Stone's three-star **Mauve** is still abuzz since its February opening and boasts a nine-course offering (no menus); Italian cuisine also rates highly. Our picks include **Scarpenera** at the Montage Beverly Hills (book a spot as the chef's table and order the vanilla caramel budino) and **Culina** at the Four Seasons Los Angeles, where you'll get modern Cali-Italian fare. Try the crudo (raw bar) when he the sweets spot with a visit to the world's first **Sprinkles Cupcakes ATM**, just swipe your credit card and a sweet treat is yours whenever you wish.

**RED** Dip into mid-century glamour at **The Beverly Hilton** (approx. \$375 per night; beverlyhilton.com), the site of the Golden Globes since 1961. Ask for a pool-facing room and be sure to book a Red Carpet Ready Facial at the labor Beauty Spa.
